### **Minutes from 11/2/11 Meeting**

**Call to Order/Introductions:** Meeting began as combined meeting for three parent subcommittees – Athletic Association, Hospitality Committee, Open House Committee. After general discussion by Dr. Tranter on purpose/function/focus of each group and suggestions on ways for mutual support each group split out to hold their own meeting; Russ Curran called CCAA meeting to order; minutes from the 10/5/11 meeting submitted and approved without discussion.

**Financial Report:** Peg Enos reported a balance of \$16156.83. Recent invoices paid were \$600 to Peg Enos for concession supplies, volleyball pre-orders, and Golf Team hats. Check was forward to American Cancer Society for \$1425 from charity volleyball game. Receipts include \$807 from football concessions, \$234 from 50/50 raffles. Financial report submitted and accepted without discussion.

**CCAA Store:** Store receipts from weekday openings and Breast Cancer charity volleyball match for October were approximately \$1400. Biggest concern remains lack of stock and need to order merchandise for holiday season. Don Scott, Peg Enos and Kim Kilroy met on 10/25 to determine merchandise needs, piece count, and size range. Don then created spreadsheet and put it out to bid. After some discussion on bids received and vendors, matter was tabled. Interested participants agreed to remain following the general meeting to award bid and finalize orders.

**Concessions:** Football ongoing. Small group of volunteers has been in place for home games. Thanksgiving Day game will require approximately 20 volunteers. Sign-up sheet distributed.

**Athletic Director's Report:** Coach Pileski noted that the Volleyball Team made the State Tournament for the first time in 17 years and congratulated Coach Watson on the growth and development of the program. He also noted that both the Boys and Girls

soccer teams, and several athletes from the Cross Country Team also qualified for post season play. Golf Team finished 10<sup>th</sup> in their division. Overall, a very successful Fall season for CCHS teams. Receipts from the Stanley Cup ice hockey game in the 4-5K range. Coach also reported that he attended a meeting along with the other Diocesan High Schools and a few other schools to discuss the continuing desire of many MIAA (Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association) members to drop Catholic/private schools from State Tournament brackets. Possibility that CCHS would be moved into Central Catholic League. While no action has been taken yet, area schools were reminded to support each other when scheduling, planning. Coach Pileski also noted that he has sent each coach a memo outlining basic expectations for end of season banquets for each fall sports team.

**School President's Report:** Dr. Tranter thanked Coach Pileski for his leadership and expertise on MIAA issues. She remarked on how fortunate Coyle and Cassidy is to have such a well respected and experienced Athletic Director. Proceeds of \$4030 from Fall Sports Booklet to be received by CCAA. Dr. Tranter also actively seeking volunteers to solicit ads and compile booklet for Winter program. Discussion regarding Hall of Fame banquet to be held in May. Dr. Tranter would like to see the program expanded to include entire CCHS Athletic Community (current athletes, past recipients, etc.), along with new inductees and their families, participate in recognition ceremony. Dr. Tranter also recognized Patti Borges for her DI softball signing at Stony Brook and expressed hope that several more were to come.

**Old Business:** Tickets for Polar Bear will be printed in house. Russ to resend graphics to Grace for copying. Russ has confirmed Too Much Fun for Polar Bear. They will play from 8-12. Sirois Catering has not returned phone calls as of yet.

**New Business:** Senior Day for football, cheerleaders will be Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. Sure Shot Promotions has been secured for Polar Bear. Each sports team expected to donate a basket for Polar Bear auctions.
